## Harris County to host Electronics Recycling Event on May 17<sup>th</sup>!













Many people are unaware that certain electronic items contain enough hazardous components which, when disposed of, can be classified as an EPA-defined hazardous waste. The average television screen or computer monitor contains four pounds of lead, while mercury from electronics waste has been cited as the leading source of mercury in municipal solid waste landfills. Additionally, many electronic components contain halogenated hydrocarbons, such as dioxin, and heavy metals, which, if disposed of improperly, pose very serious threats to public health and the environment.

In order to protect our local waterways, Harris County is hosting an **Electronics Recycling Day** on **Saturday, May 17, 2003**. This one-day event will take place at the **Barbara Bush Library** located at **6815 Cypresswood Drive, Spring** from **8:00 AM to 2:00 PM only**.

Up to 10 units of each of the following items will be accepted from Harris County residents -

- Computer Monitors
- Central Processing Units
- Laptops
- Televisions
- Printers
- Word Processors
- Scanners

- Fax Machines
- VCRs
- Telephones
- Cellular phones
- Calculators
- Stereos
- Small Personal Electronics

The following items will **NOT** be accepted -

- Hazardous Wastes
- Business Wastes
- Microwaves
- Washers and Dryers
- Air conditioners
- Refrigerators and Freezers
- Photocopy Machines
- Household Trash
