DA Commends Law Enforcement in Return of Fugitive Tata

(Houston, Tx) Harris County District Attorney Pat Lykos commends the International, federal, state and local law enforcement agencies involved in the apprehension of fugitive Jessica Tata and her return to Harris County.

Lykos said, "Tata fled to Nigeria three and a half weeks ago—her arrest and swift arrival back to Houston was the result of the actions of many individuals from many jurisdictions, working diligently to bring her to justice."

Tata has been charged with fourteen felony offenses for leaving seven children unattended as a fire burned in her home daycare facility in February. Four of the children perished in the fire, and three others were injured.

A magistrate in Probable Cause Court this morning declined to set bonds for Tata's numerous felony cases. She is scheduled to appear in the 180th District Court Wednesday afternoon at 1:30.
