Daycare Owner Sentenced to 80 Years in Prison and \$10,000 Fine for Fatal Fire

A jury took just over seven hours to decide the fate of a daycare owner who was convicted of murder after a fire killed four children in her care and seriously injured three others. Jessica Tata was sentenced to 80 years in prison and a \$10,000 fine for the February 2011 offense. Tata left the infants and toddlers home alone while she shopped at a local Target store. The blaze broke out when a pot of boiling oil left on the stove ignited. By the time Tata arrived back home, the house was engulfed in flames.
